Patrick J. Bradley, Irish by birth, graduated from University College Dublin, and completed his Otorhinolaryngology- Head and Neck Surgery residency in Liverpool. He was appointed Head and Neck Oncologic Surgeon, 1982 at the University Hospital Nottingham. He recently completed an MBA (Health) at Nottingham University through an NHS Bursary over a 5-year period. He has been awarded a Honorary Fellowship of the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists (London) and Honorary Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

He has published widely with more than 150 peer-reviewed articles. He is a member of numerous journal; UK Editorial Boards; Journal of Laryngology, Clinical Otolaryngology and Otology, Oral Oncology, CME Otolaryngology, as well as International Journals: Laryngoscope, Head and Neck, Acta Otolaryngologica Scandinavia, as well as Section Editor of Head and Neck Oncology, Current Opinions ORL-HNS.

He has been invited as visiting Professor to many parts of the world and was the Eugene Myers International Head and Neck Lecturer at the American Academy ORL-HNS in 2000. He has been involved in the British Association of Otolaryngologists, Head and Neck Surgeons and has been Chairman of the Education and Training Committee, and is currently Chairman of the Head and Neck Surgery Group. He is a member of the RCS London, Cancer Committee representing BAOHNS. He has been an examiner for the FRCS ORL-HNS at the Conjoint Board of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons.

He has been President of the British Association of Head and Neck Oncologists (2003 – 2005) and The European Laryngological Society (2004 – 2006) and is currently The President of Midlands Institute of Otolaryngology (2005 – 2007). He has recently been made National lead Clinician – Head and Neck Surgery for the English National Health Service (2003 – 2006). He is a Founding Member of the International Academy of Oral Oncology, and Founding Board Member of the European Head and Neck Society, as well as Vice-President of the European Academy ORL-HNS.
